

The importance of emergency preparedness extends into the classroom. Students, even in higher education settings, look to the instructor for guidance and definitive action during an emergency. Faculty should take a few minutes at the start of each semester to familiarize their students with basic evacuation and emergency procedures. Provide leadership if an emergency arises and follow emergency procedures for all building alarms and emergencies. Clearly cover the basic emergency procedures for the class during the first week of class (10 minutes of pre- planning can save lives).
